

## Edward Abbey on ECODEFENSE:

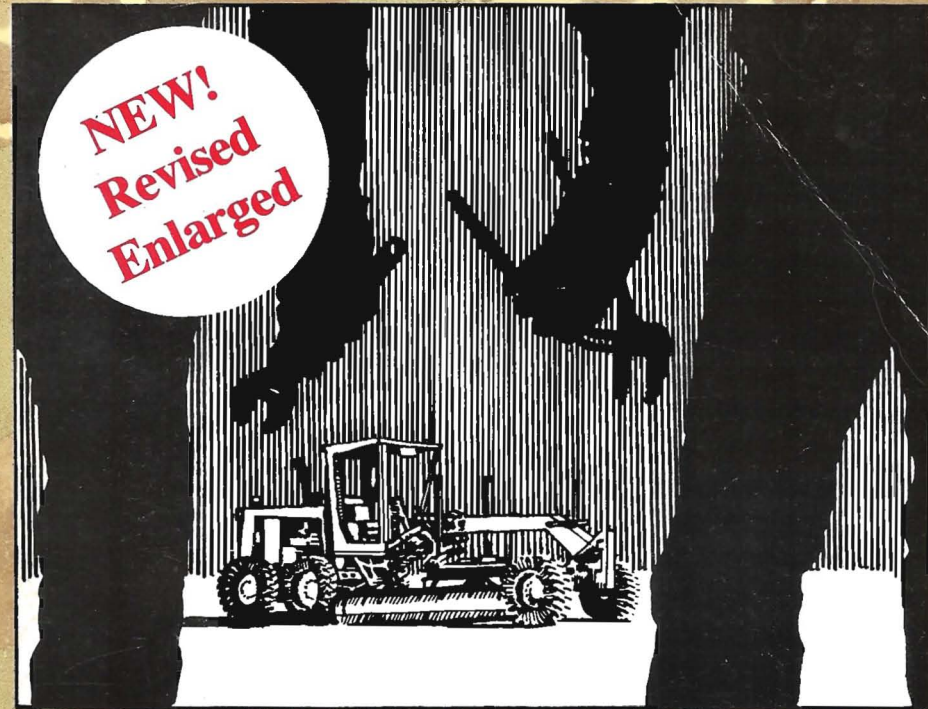
